# Proposed Airport South Industrial Project

The Airport South Industrial (ASI) Project proposes to develop 6.6 million square feet of warehouses south of I-5. It is not part of the Metro Air-



port development. It would be located on valuable farmland, next to the West Lake neighborhood, the Paso Verde Elementary School, adjacent to the canal

leading into Fisherman's Lake.

The Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for the ASI is out for review. Public comments must be submitted by July

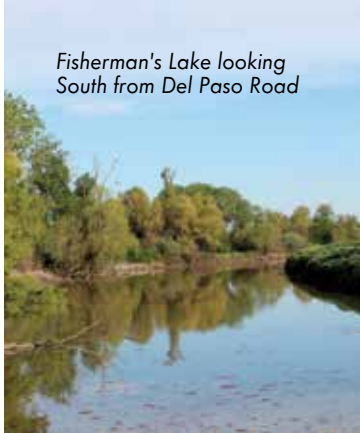
17th. Right now, is the time for the community to speak up about whether this is a good idea, or not. Should more farmland be paved? Should we sacrifice habi-

tat for warehouses? Do we want to live next to warehouses, and endure more traffic, more noise and more pollution? Or should warehouses be placed in "infill" areas where there is already water, sewer and roads to accommodate this use, and where the jobs and investment are needed.

If approved, a proposal to annex the ASI into the City of Sacramento will be made in the Fall by the Sacramento County Local Agency Formation Commission, known as LAFCo. The primary reason to annex it is to access city infrastructure, services, and water — nonexistent on this property — with an unknown impact on the City budget and our service-use fees.

The Sacramento LAFCo Board includes seven county-

wide members. Lisa Kaplan, the District 1 Councilmember, represents Sacramento on the Board. LAFCo's goals include: 1) Preserving agricultural and open space lands; and 2) Discouraging Urban Sprawl. We need to support them in making the right decision.



The Environmental Council of Sacramento (ECOS) are using their own expertise, and have also hired subject matter experts, to review and comment on the DEIR. Their comments will be submitted by the July 17 deadline. If there are others in the community with expertise or interest, they are encouraged to send in their comments on this important document. And, to attend the public hearing in the fall.
